Painting, like these images, were made over 17,000 years ago. They were huge painting on the walls of caves. The colours were limited as they didn't have access to paints so used natural materials to create marks and shapes such as crushed berries, burnt wood, plants and animals fats mixed with natural pigments.


Natural materials and products can produce pigments to make different colours.
Spices, berries, leaves and even mud can create a natural paint palette.
