

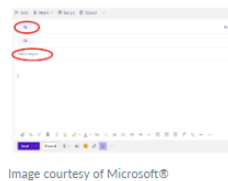

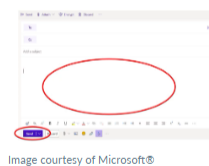
Key Vocabulary	Definition
Email	Electronic- mail which allows us to send messages and files from one account to another over a network.
Attachment	A function that allows you add files to an electronic message (email) before sending.
Spam	Nonsense or junk emails, used for advertisement or harassment.
BCC	Blind carbon copy allows you to send a copy of the email written to another person without other readers seeing.
CC	Carbon copy allows you to send a copy of an email to another person's email address.
Domain	The online location or hosting website that the email belongs to.
Account	An online or intranet service, which stores information safely behind a username and password.
Password	A unique combination of letters, numbers or symbols that protects personal information online.

Communication has evolved overtime; the first email was developed and sent in 1971 by an American computer programmer called Ray Tomlinson. Since then, email has evolved and is now one of the most common ways to communicate.



Sending an email

1. Type the email address of the person you want to 'send' the email to.
2. In the 'subject' bar write a short title for your email.



Sending an email

3. 'Compose' (write) an email and include:
 - ✓ At least one question.
 - ✓ At least one interesting fact about yourself.
4. Press 'Send'.



Adding an attachment

Paperclip icon – allows files to be inserted from the computer's hard drive or from a cloud storage service.
