I know that material can be joined using different techniques including sewing.

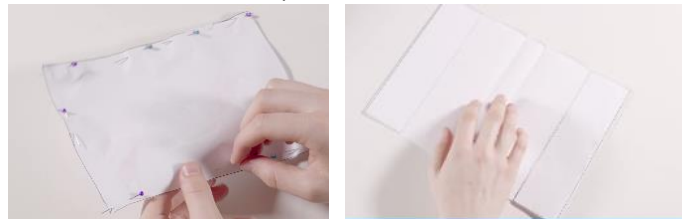
I know how to decorate my design by adding details to improve its appearance.



When we look at different type of fastening, we need to think about what the benefits of each fastening are and what the disadvantages are too.

When we create a design, we have to think about the design criteria, a list of features the help designers focus their ideas and test the success of them.

Assembling a paper template will help us check the product works and looks like our design. It will help us draw the same shape onto different materials.



Decorating means when we add extra details to our product to make it look better. We might use things such as:

- Wool
- Fabric
- Buttons
- Sequins



To evaluate our product we use our design criteria and decide whether we have met each point. We look at the good and bad points of our product and then think about how to improve them.

Assemble	To put parts together.
Design criteria	To help designers focus their ideas and test them.
Evaluation	Looking at the good and bad points about something, and then thinking how to improve it.
Fastening	Something that holds two pieces of material together securely or shuts something.
Running-stitch	A simple style of sewing in a straight line with no overlapping.
Stencil	A shape that you can draw around.
Target customer	A person or group of people who you expect to buy the product.
Template	A stencil you use to help draw the same shape more easily on to different materials.
