

Vocabulary	
Residential	Areas where people live
Recreational	Areas where people play and spend any free time, e.g. parks and playgrounds
Retail	Areas where people buy and sell products such as shops and the market
Community	A group of people, living and working together in the same area
8 point compass	A more detailed way of understanding directions, including North East
Goods	Things which are made and traded
Transport	Ways of getting around, including cars, buses, trains, trams and boats
Investigation	A way of trying to find out how or why something happens

My Key Learning

Our area

In Year 3, we begin to ask geographical questions. We begin to ask why things are the way they are, and how did our geography affect the way that we live now.

We branch out from "man-made" features, to identifying physical and human characteristics of our local area. We complete this by going on a fieldwork walk into Eccles to study our local area



To give more accurate directions, we use an 8 point compass which includes North West and South East
