### What do I already know?

Symbols which are special to Muslims include a taqiyah cap, ka'aba and calligraphy (writing).

### What Muslims believe:

Allah is the word for God in Arabic.

Muslims believe that there is only God. They use the word **Tawhid**.

### Shahada:

This is daily prayer and shows faithfulness to Allah.

There are 99 names for Allah.



The Prophet Muhammad was sent by Allah to share the messages of the Muslim faith.

When saying the Prophet Muhammad's name, Muslims will say "Peace Be Upon Him".

Stories of the Prophet Muhammad are shared to show his example of being faithful to Allah.

### Muhammad receives the message from God:

The Night of Power was the first time that Allah spoke to the Prophet Muhammad through the Qu'ran.



The Qu'ran is the Muslim holy book.

It is cared for by keeping it on a stand.
