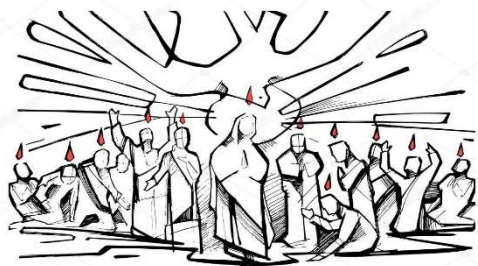

What do I already know?

Christian beliefs and traditions:

Christians believe that Jesus shows them how to live a life that pleases God. A life of love for all.

The stations of the cross in church retell the story of Jesus's final journey. They are displayed in churches.

Resurrection means bringing back to life.



The Easter story is the story of salvation – God sent Jesus to save and rescue people from sin.

Bible Book of Acts:

The Book of Acts was written by the author of the Gospel of St Luke. It tells of the events following Jesus' resurrection.



Although the Disciples were Jewish, they taught a new message, still linked to their Jewish faith, that became the start of Christianity.

Saint Paul wrote letters to many nations spreading the words of Jesus. These letters follow the book of Acts in the New Testament.

Pentecost:

This celebration is seen as the birth of the Christian church – the church's birthday.



Symbols of Pentecost include the dove (Holy Spirit); flames, the cross and the colour red.

The Holy Spirit:

The Holy Spirit is like a battery for Christians. It helps them to keep going and live in the way God and Jesus would expect. It is part of the Trinity.



The Holy Spirit can be represented in lots of different ways.

The Kingdom of God:

The Kingdom of God is not a place or a country but, for Christians, it means to know God, love Him and follow Him.

The Lord's prayer reflects the Kingdom of God.
