## My Key Learning



### What do I already know?

The story of The Fall is in the first book of the Old Testament (Genesis 3).

Christians believe that the fall is when Adam and Eve separated themselves from God and their world by not following his command.



Christians believe that humans need rescue and God will rescue them (**salvation**).

<b>donation</b>	give something to a charity or organisation
<b>Gospel</b>	the first five books of the New Testament
<b>icon</b>	a picture or image (sometimes of Jesus)
<b>Immanuel</b>	God with us
<b>incarnation</b>	in human form
<b>reflect</b>	to think about carefully
<b>saviour</b>	saving people from something. In Christianity Jesus saving people from sin
<b>sin</b>	breaking a religious or moral law

### Christians believe:

The stories in the Old Testament tell of God's plan to save people. These are the **People of God**.

The prophets talk about the coming of the **Messiah** who will help people find their way back to God.



Isaiah and Micah explain the expectations of the Messiah in the **Old Testament**.

### The New Testament tells Christians that:



Jesus was sent as a **saviour** and a messiah.

Jesus was the **incarnation** – he was sent as God in the flesh and as God who came to live amongst the human race.

Not everyone believed that Jesus was the Messiah. Most Jews did not believe this at the time even though Jesus was a Jew.

### What does Christmas mean to Christians?

Christians try to think about the true meaning of Christmas and salvation.

Christians reflect and on how Jesus brings peace with God and good news for all people.

Not everyone has a faith but people show how they want peace in the world in different ways.
