The Gospels:

There are four Gospels that start the new Testament in the Bible:

Matthew, Mark, Luke and John



The Four Gospels

Christians reflect and on how Jesus brings peace with God and good news for all people.

Not everyone has a faith but people show how they want peace in the world in different ways. Humanists do not believe in God but they believe in taking care of each other.

The Gospels:

The gospels tell the narrative of Jesus' life as well as sharing Jesus' teachings and the parables he told.

Jesus taught people about the two greatest commandments – to love God and to love your neighbour.

The parable of the two builders:

The parable reminds Christians of the importance of building their faith and their lives on firm foundations.



The Sermon on the Mount:

Jesus uses this sermon as a way of reminding people how to live their lives.

The sermon helps Christians to think about how they can love God and love their neighbour.

The Centurion's Servant:

Jesus wanted to share "good news" beyond those who were Christian.

The Beatitudes

The poor in spirit are blessed, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

Those who mourn are blessed, for they will be comforted.

The gentle are blessed, for they will inherit the earth.

Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness are blessed, for they will be filled.

The merciful are blessed, for they will be shown mercy.

The pure in heart are blessed, for they will see God.

The peacemakers are blessed, for they will be called sons of God.

Those who are persecuted for righteousness are blessed, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs.
